1	The development must be begun not later than three years beginning with the date of this permission. Reason: To comply with the requirements of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 as amended by Section 51 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004.
2	The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in accordance with the following approved plans: 1:1250 Location Plan - Drawing Number 2024 - P35-PLG-05 Proposed Block Plan – Drawing Number 2024 - P35-PLG-06 Proposed Site Layout Plan - Drawing Number 2024 - P35-PLG-02 Rev D Proposed Elevations - Drawing Number 2024 - P35-PLG-04 Design & Access Statement – C Project 9 th June 2025

3	<p>The 12 car parking spaces and 2 servicing bays, and other vehicular access arrangements shown on Drawing Number 2024 - P35-PLG-02 Rev D shall be formally marked out on site and made fully available for use prior to the car wash extension hereby permitted first being used, and shall be retained thereafter for their intended purpose.</p> <p>Reason: In the interests of highway safety and having due regard to policy DM13 of the Havant Borough Local Plan (Core Strategy) 2011 and the National Planning Policy Framework.</p>
4	<p>The development hereby permitted shall only be carried out in accordance with the Arboricultural Tree survey/Arboricultural Impact Assessment Document No: 801161 ver2 dated 20/10/2025 and British Standard BS5837: 2012 (Trees in relation to design, demolition, and construction - Recommendations).</p> <p>Reason: To ensure the continuity of amenity value afforded by the trees in question and in accordance with policies CS16 and DM8 of the Havant Borough Core Strategy (2011) and the National Planning Policy Framework.</p>
5	<p>The external materials used shall match, in type, colour and texture, those of the existing building so far as practicable.</p> <p>Reason: In the interests of the amenities of the area and having due regard to policy CS16 of the Havant Borough Local Plan (Core Strategy) 2011 and the National Planning Policy Framework.</p>
6	<p>A Biodiversity Gain Plan shall be prepared in accordance with the Statutory Biodiversity Net Gain (BNG) Metric (Vix Moughal, 5 November 2025) and must include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) information about the steps taken or to be taken to minimise the adverse effect of the development on the biodiversity of the on-site habitat and any other habitat; (2) the pre-development biodiversity value of the on-site habitat; (3) the post-development biodiversity value of the on-site habitat; (4) any registered off-site biodiversity gain allocated to the development and the value of that gain in relation to the development; (5) any biodiversity credits purchased for the development; and

7	<p>The development shall not commence until a Habitat Management and Monitoring Plan (HMMP), prepared in accordance with the approved Biodiversity Gain Plan, has been submitted to, and approved in writing by, the local planning authority. The HMMP shall include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) a non-technical summary; (2) the roles and responsibilities of the people or organisation(s) delivering the HMMP; (3) the planned habitat creation and enhancement works to create or improve habitat to achieve the biodiversity net gain in accordance with the approved Biodiversity Gain Plan; (4) the management measures to maintain habitat in accordance with the approved Biodiversity Gain Plan for a period of 30 years from the completion of development; and (5) the monitoring methodology and frequency in respect of the created or enhanced habitat. <p>Reason: To ensure the development delivers a biodiversity net gain on site in accordance with Schedule 7A of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.</p>
8	<p>Notice in writing shall be given to the Council when the:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) HMMP has been implemented; and (2) habitat creation and enhancement works as set out in the HMMP have been completed. <p>The created and/or enhanced habitat specified in the approved HMMP shall be managed and maintained in accordance with the approved HMMP. Monitoring reports shall be submitted to local planning authority in writing in accordance with the methodology and frequency specified in the approved HMMP.</p> <p>Reason: To ensure the development delivers a biodiversity net gain on site in accordance with Schedule 7A of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.</p>
9	<p>Within one month of the development hereby permitted becoming operational, a noise assessment shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The assessment shall demonstrate that the specific noise level of the two car wash bays and new plant room shall not exceed the noise criteria detailed in table 4 of the dBx Noise Impact Assessment ref: 25044-R01-SW as assessed in accordance with BS 4142:2014+A1:2019. Should the noise criteria be exceeded, further appropriate noise mitigation measures shall be submitted to and agreed with</p>

	<p>the LPA and subsequently implemented to an agreed timetable to ensure the criteria are met.</p> <p>Reason: To protect the amenity of neighbouring residents having due regard to policies CS16 and DM10 of the Havant Borough Local Plan (Core Strategy) 2011 and the National Planning Policy Framework.</p>
10	<p>The hours of operation shall be restricted to 08:00hrs -22:00hrs Monday to Saturday, and 08:30hrs – 21:00hrs on Sundays and Public Holidays.</p> <p>Reason: To protect the amenity of neighbouring residents having due regard to policies CS16 and DM10 of the Havant Borough Local Plan (Core Strategy) 2011 and the National Planning Policy Framework.</p>
11	<p>No additional external lighting shall be erected without first submitting and agreeing with the LPA the details of the method of lighting, direction of light emission and luminance levels. Any such agreed scheme of lighting shall thereafter be implemented and maintained in full accordance with the approved details.</p> <p>Reason: To protect the amenity of neighbouring residents having due regard to policies CS16 and DM10 of the Havant Borough Local Plan (Core Strategy) 2011 and the National Planning Policy Framework.</p>

1: APPEAL INFORMATION

NOTIFICATION TO BE SENT TO AN APPLICANT WHEN A LOCAL PLANNING AUTHORITY REFUSE PLANNING PERMISSION OR GRANT IT SUBJECT TO CONDITIONS

- These notes are for information only and do not purport to set out the law on the subject.
- Only the applicant possesses the right of appeal.

Appeals to the Secretary of State

- If you are aggrieved by the decision of your local planning authority to refuse permission for the proposed development or to grant it subject to conditions, then you can appeal to the Secretary of State under section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
- If this is a decision on a planning application relating to the same or substantially the same land and development as is already the subject of an enforcement notice and you want to appeal against your local planning authority's decision on your application, then you must do so within 28 days of the date of this notice.
- If an enforcement notice is served relating to the same or substantially the same land and development as in your application and if you want to appeal against your local planning authority's decision on your application, then you must do so within 28 days of the date of service of the enforcement notice, or within 6 months [12 weeks in the case of a householder appeal] of the date of this notice, whichever period expires earlier.
- If this is a decision to refuse planning permission for a householder application and you want to appeal against your local planning authority's decision then you must do so within 12 weeks of the date of this notice.
- If this is a decision to refuse planning permission for a minor commercial application and you want to appeal against your local planning authority's decision then you must do so within 12 weeks of the date of this notice.
- If this is a decision to refuse express consent for the display of an advertisement and you want to appeal against your local planning authority's decision then you must do so within 8 weeks of the date of receipt of this notice.
- If this is a decision to refuse consent to work on a tree which is subject to a Tree Preservation Order and you want to appeal against your local planning authority's decision then you must do so within 28 days of the date of this notice.
- If this is a decision to refuse any other type of application and you want to appeal against your local planning authority's decision then you must do so within 6 months of the date of this notice.

- The Secretary of State can allow a longer period for giving notice of an appeal but will not normally be prepared to use this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of appeal.
- The Secretary of State need not consider an appeal if it seems to the Secretary of State that the local planning authority could not have granted planning permission for the proposed development or could not have granted it without the conditions they imposed, having regard to the statutory requirements, to the provisions of any development order and to any directions given under a development order.

If you intend to submit an appeal that you would like examined by inquiry, then you must notify the Local Planning Authority and Planning Inspectorate (inquiryappeals@planninginspectorate.gov.uk) at least 10 days before submitting the appeal. Further details are on GOV.UK.

3: FURTHER INFORMATION FOR APPLICATIONS RELATING TO NEW VEHICULAR ACCESS/DROPPED KERBS

This page provides essential information for residents, explaining that planning permission and dropped kerb consent are two separate requirements. While planning permission may be granted by the local planning authority, dropped kerb consent must still be obtained from Hampshire County Council, as they are responsible for managing access to the public highway.

It is particularly important to highlight that for applications involving classified roads (A, B, and C roads), applicants must provide evidence of planning permission as part of their dropped kerb application. This ensures that all necessary safety, traffic, and infrastructure considerations are properly addressed.

4: SOUTHERN GAS ADVISORY NOTE

In June 2021 SGN issued a comprehensive advisory note

There are a number of risks created by built over gas mains and services; these are:

Pipework loading - pipes are at risk from loads applied by the new structure and are more susceptible to interference damage.

Gas entry into buildings - pipework proximity increases risk of gas entry in buildings. Leaks arising from previous external pipework able to track directly into main building from unsealed entry.

Occupier safety - lack or no fire resistance of pipework, fittings, or meter installation. Means of escape could be impeded by an enclosed meter.

Please note therefore, if you plan to dig, or carry out building work to a property, site, or public highway within our gas network, you must:

1. Check your proposals against the information held at <https://www.linesearchbeforeudig.co.uk/> to assess any risk associated with your development and
2. Contact our Plant Protection team to let them know. Plant location enquiries must be made via email, but you can phone us with general plant protection queries. See our contact details below:

In the event of an overbuild on our gas network, the pipework must be altered, you may be temporarily disconnected, and your insurance may be invalidated.
